FELLOWSHIP OFFERING

Leviticus 3; 7:11-34

Any animal without defect from herd or flock; variety of breads

Voluntary act of worship; thanksgiving and fellowship (it included a communal meal)

Sense of distance from God - Sense of restoration

SIN OFFERING

Leviticus 4:1-5:13; 6:24-30; 8:14-17; 16:3-22

1. Young bull: for high priest and congregation
2. Male goat: for leader
3. Female goat or lamb: for common person
4. Dove or pigeon: for the poor
5. Tenth of an ephah of fine flour: for the very poor

Mandatory atonement for specific unintentional sin; confession of sin; forgiveness of sin; cleansing from defilement

Sense of guilt - Sense of release

GUILT OFFERING

Leviticus 5:14-6:7; 7:1-6

Ram or lamb

Mandatory atonement for unintentional sin requiring restitution; cleansing from defilement; make restitution; pay 20% fine

Sense of sorrow - Sense of forgiveness

Rom 12:1

When more than one kind of offering was presented (as in Numbers 7:16,17), the procedure was usually as follows: (1) sin offering or guilt offering, (2) burnt offering, (3) fellowship offering and grain offering (along with a drink offering). This sequence furnishes part of the spiritual significance of the sacrificial system. First, sin had to be dealt with (sin offering or guilt offering). Second, the worshiper committed himself completely to God (burnt offering and grain offering). Third, fellowship or communion between the Lord, the priest and the worshiper was established (fellowship offering).

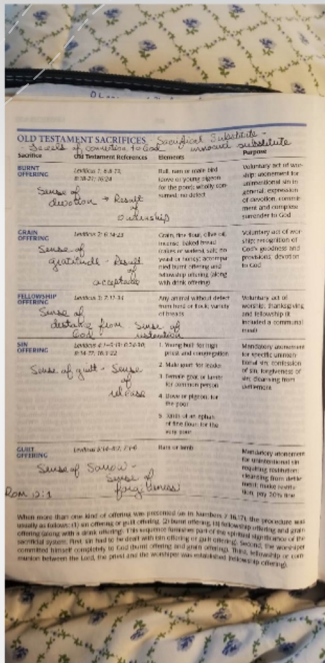

You're Already Holy...

+13 Therefore, with minds that are alert and fully sober, set your hope on the grace to be brought to you when Jesus Christ is revealed at his coming. 14 As obedient children, do not conform to the evil desires you had when you lived in ignorance. 15 But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; 16 for it is written: “Be holy, because I am holy.
